THE DISABLED VETERANS' LIFE MEMORIAL FOUNDATION ANNOUNCES PROJECT ARCHITECT

Shalom Baranes Associates to Complete and Implement Design of The American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial in Washington D.C.

(DELRAY BEACH, FL) – November 9, 2009 – The <u>Disabled Veterans' LIFE</u> <u>Memorial Foundation</u> today announced that Washington D.C.-based architectural firm <u>Shalom Baranes Associates</u>, <u>PC</u>, has been retained as project architect for the American Veterans Disabled for Life Memorial. The Memorial is America's first monument dedicated to disabled veterans of all wars, both living and deceased, as well as their families and caregivers.

As the project architect, Shalom Baranes Associates will complete the final design and produce the construction drawings for the Memorial, ensure design compliance during construction, and interact with the army of contractors and consultants involved in bringing the vision of the Memorial to life. The Memorial's design has been developed by Michael Vergason Landscape Architects, Ltd., Alexandria, Virginia, with the graphics, text and bronze components of the Memorial created by artist Larry Kirkland in collaboration with Cloud Gehshan Associates.

"We are extremely excited to assist in the materialization of Michael Vergason's vision," said Founder and Principal Shalom Baranes. "This Memorial represents an important part of America's history, and we are grateful for the chance to take part in its creation. We look forward to working with everyone involved to make the Memorial a reality."

The focal point of the Memorial will be a star-shaped reflecting pool, its surface broken by a single eternal flame. A grove of trees will stand sentry beside the pool, signifying the persistence of hope. The Foundation anticipates breaking ground on the Memorial in 2010.
