### New passport rules go into effect June 1, 2009

### Avoid the last minute rush, apply for your passport now!

Washington, D.C.— The full requirements of the Western Hemisphere Travel Initiative will be implemented on June 1, 2009, which will require all travelers

returning to the United States from Canada, Mexico, the Caribbean and Bermuda—including those who go by land or sea—to have a passport or other federally approved identification. The U.S. State Department suggests that anyone planning to travel outside the country obtain a passport or other approved

travel documents to avoid any disruptions in their travel plans. A passport is valid for travel anywhere in the world by air, land and sea.
